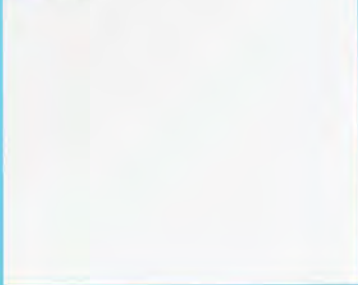
Hole puncher

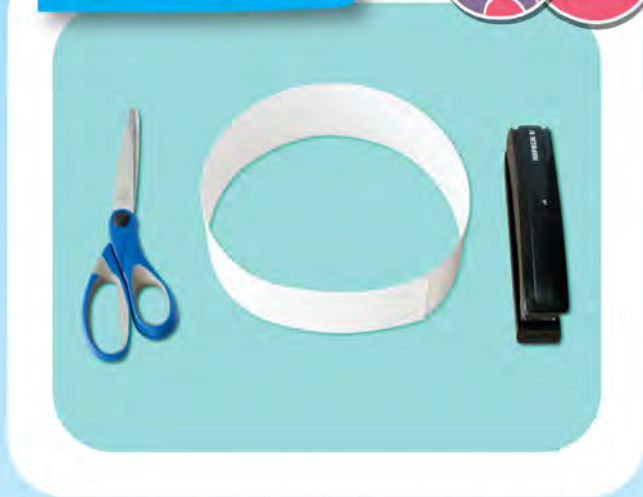
HEAD BAND:
(base the length of headband to a child's head circumference)



Templates provided



Step 1



- Measure around the head of your child and cut out the headband strip to size.
- Staple the ends together.

Step 2



- Print templates provided and cut them out.

Step 3



- Use **Bostik Blu Stik** to stick the pieces onto the cardboard paper.

Step 4



- Use **Bostik Glitter Glue**, colour markers and pencils to decorate the eggs and bow tie.



Step 5



- You can even use **Bostik Blu-Tack® Colour** to decorate the eggs and bow tie!

Step 6



- Colour the inside of the rabbit ears with pink markers or pencils.
- Use **Bostik Craft PVA Glue** to glue down the white cotton balls.

Step 7



- Cut fringes along the tissue paper. Be sure to keep one end intact.
- Use **Bostik Blu Stik** to glue down the tissue paper around the headband.

Step 8



- Secure the rabbit ears and eggs to the headband with a stapler.



Step 9



- Use a hole puncher to punch two holes as shown.
- Cut the elastic to the required length and thread it through the holes.

Step 10



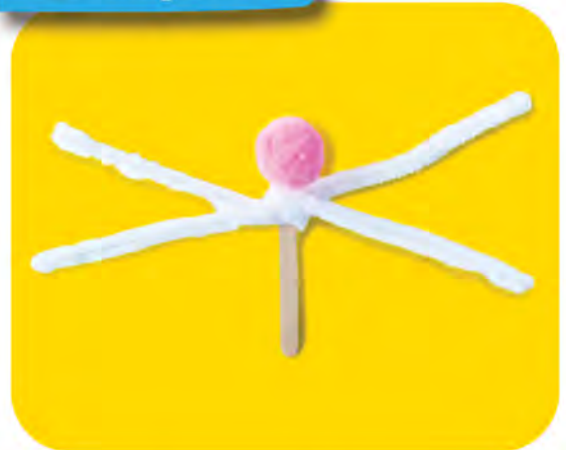
- Use **Bostik Craft PVA Glue** to secure the pom pom to the popsicle stick.

Step 11



- Twist two pipecleaners around the popsicle stick.

Step 12



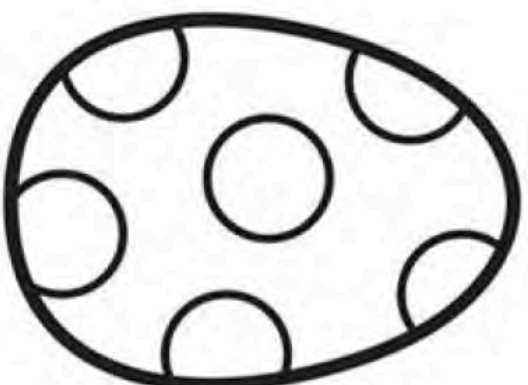
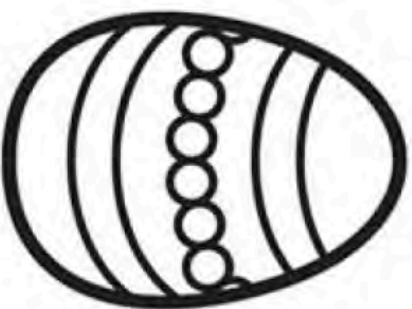
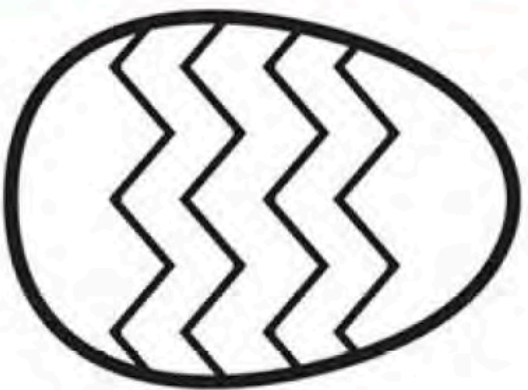
- Your rabbit nose and whiskers are ready!



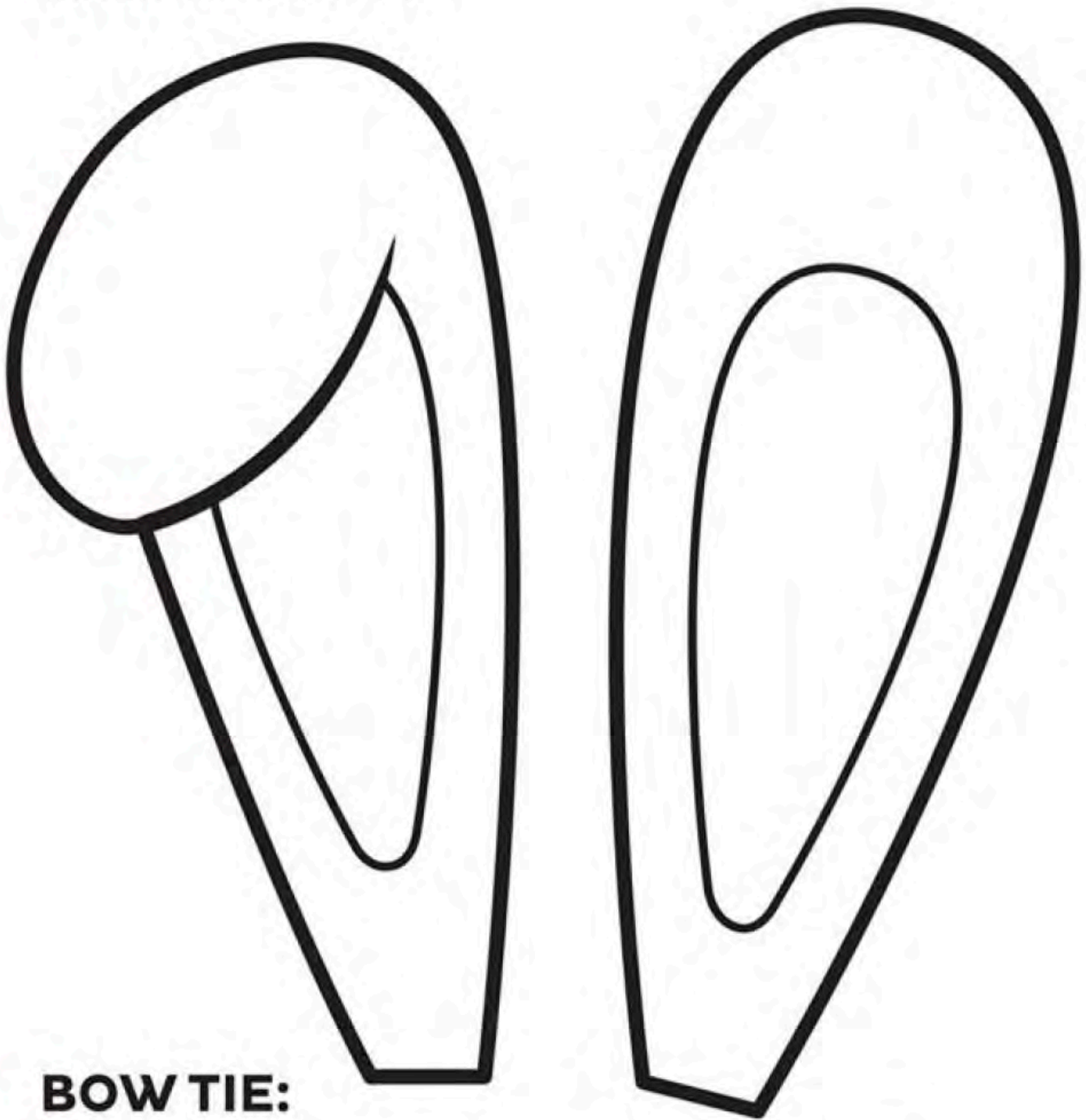
